Pastor's Paragraphs

"TWO WAYS TO ROB A CHURCH"

The whole nation is in a state of shock. During the past several weeks, there has been a rash of art thefts from churches in Italy.



Just last week Italian police recovered a priceless painting by Titian and arrested ten people. But these thieves were scarcely behind bars before burglars got away with 3 more precious paintings and a gem enclustered chalice from another church in Padua, Italy.

In all probability these thieves were members of the Catholic Church since most Italians are. How tragic that these Catholic men would rob the Catholic Churches of their priceless treasures.

That's one way to rob a church—**CARRY OUT OF THE CHURCH THAT WHICH BELONGS TO THE LORD.**

Then there's another, a more subtle way, to rob the Lord's Church. Baptists specialize in this method. **WE CAN REFUSE TO CARRY IN THAT WHICH BELONGS TO THE LORD.** (For every dollar the Lord loses in thieves carrying treasures out of the church, He loses a thousand to thieves who refuse to carry in that which is His)

That's pretty strong language! Perhaps this verse will be less offensive—"Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings." (Malachi 3:8)

They may or may not catch the Italian art thieves—but the good Lord always gets His man—or woman.

BUS MINISTRY

The Bus Ministry of the First Baptist Church continues to grow and each week we are pleased that we are bringing in more people into the Lord's House to study the Word of God and hear it preached in our Worship Services. On this Sunday, September 26, we will add our third bus with Mr. Erastus Trigg serving as our Bus Captain for this route. This route will basically encompass the area out along Palafox Highway and will include the Brentwood-Crescent Lake, Old Palafox Highway area. Young people serving on this crew will be Doug Wamble, and Janice Wiggins. Others will be added as the route grows.

Route 2 under the direction of Captain Max Dickson has continued to have very phenomenal growth. It is now bringing in an average of 35 people each Sunday. Within the next couple of weeks we will be adding our 4th bus which will take in the area along Mobile Highway to the North side and will help alleviate some of the crowding on this West bus.

Route 1 under the direction of Captain Bob Fetrow and Assistant Captain Pete Urban is beginning to pick back up from the Summer and is adding a new area along Johnson Avenue and should shortly have its average up to a full bus.

Workers are needed every Saturday morning to help us work new area and solicit new bus riders on behalf of our Bus Ministry. A blessing would be your if you can give the time from 9:00 until 12:00 on Saturday mornings to this very rewarding work.
