ALL READY FOR A NEW YEAR

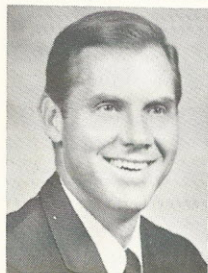

The way he spelled his name is of no great significance. There's something distinctive about the man's writing that identifies the author. We call it LITERARY STYLE.

Many of the Believers in Antioch didn't even know they were being called Christians. (Acts 11:26) It was not a term they used in referring to one another. It was a term used by unbelievers — in derision. (In order to pronounce it like they did, you almost had to snarl when you said it) How they hated those early followers of THE WAY!

As was true in the case of Mr. Shakespeare's plays, there was something distinctive about these early Believers. Again it had to do with style—LIFE STYLE. There was something radically different about the way they lived. Their lives reminded people of Jesus Christ.

Pardon me for making this question personal but I must not ask it of YOU or even US. I must ask myself (and I hope that you will ask yourself)—IS THERE ANYTHING WHICH IS DISTINCTIVELY CHRISTIAN ABOUT MY LIFE STYLE?

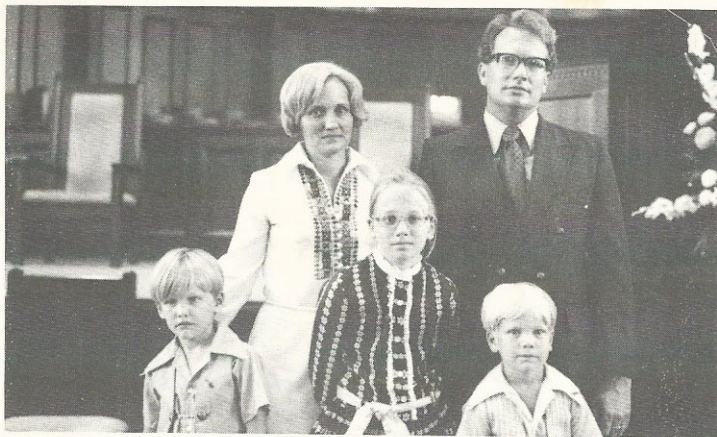
