

SUNDAY'S SPEAKER

Mr. Don Sutton, star pitcher with the Los Angeles Dodgers, will speak at both services on Sunday. Don is a deeply committed Christian young man who is active in his church as well as in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Campus Crusade.

Mr. Sutton, who is visiting his parents in Molino, developed his pitching at Tate High School. After a year at Gulf Coast Junior College, he joined the Dodger organization. After only a year in the Minors, he was moved up to the Major League in September of 1965. In the Spring of 1966, he became a starting pitcher with the Dodgers and has just completed his best year ever, a record of 17 wins against 12 losses.

Don is married to Patti Luther of Burbank, California. They have a 2 year old son, Daren. Their home is in Glendale, California.

This fall, Don returns to Whittier College where he is working on a Bachelor of Science in Marketing.

BUDGET TO BE VOTED ON SUNDAY

The proposed budget was mailed out to members of the congregation and was presented to the congregation on this past Wednesday, October 20th, for questions and discussion. It will be presented Sunday morning for adoption.

The Budget Planning Committee, headed by Dr. Charles Clevenger, carefully studied the needs for every organization of the church in preparing its recommendations. In addition to needs here at home, the recommended budget also calls for an increase in the amount given to World Missions through the cooperative program.

The Committee's recommendation has been carefully studied by the Finance Committee and the Deacons.

The official vote of the church on next Sunday morning marks the beginning of our Stewardship Program which will culminate on Pledge Day, Sunday, November 21st.


