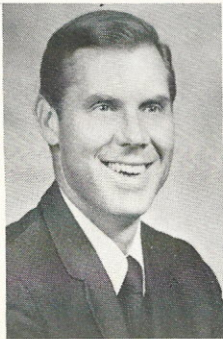

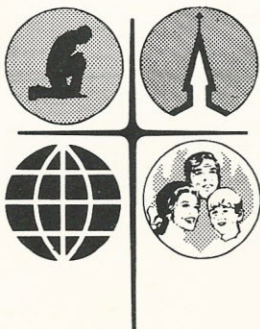

Another new record was set this past Sunday as 110 riders came in on our 3 buses. This certainly represents a very fine effort on the part of the bus crews as well as those riding the buses. Many of our bus riders are assisting by telling their friends and neighbors about the Bus Ministry and are getting them to ride. The 59 riders and 8 workers on Capt. Max Dickson's bus was certainly wonderful. Due to this effort, it will take 2 buses on this route beginning next week. This will give us 4 buses in our 6 months old Bus Ministry.

The 36 on Capt. Bob Fetrow's bus is a record for this route. Previously their high had been 30 riders. Capt. Rat Trigg's new route continues to grow each week.
