

GIVING STOCK TO THE CHURCH

Each year we have members who want to make gifts of stock to our church. The government permits a tax deduction for the full amount of such gifts and does not require any tax on the gain. As a result of this tax credit, more of our people have been using this method of making gifts to the church. This is not taking advantage of a "loophole" in the tax laws because the laws were written to encourage such gifts. Since our books will be closed on December 31, such gifts need to be made by that date.

It is not necessary that the money be received from this stock by December 31, but it is necessary that the transfer of stock be made by this date. If you have any question about the procedure of making gifts, please call the church office.


