



# Pastor's Paragraphs

## "AND THE GANDERS TOO . . ."

Some folk have the ability to make us SMILE and THINK at the same time. Jim Griffith is such a person. He recently



wrote for the Tennessee Baptist paper, "The U. S. Surgeon General, addressing a gathering of women, said research shows that 'smoking causes wrinkles and women who smoke are more likely to be more wrinkled than non-smokers 20 years their senior.'

Said one woman-smoker: "That does it for me. I quit!" It is presumed that not too many women will want to see their smooth complexions go up in smoke.

This does not present a very pleasant prospect: 'a cough and crow's feet with every pack.' Or commercially speaking, 'a smooth smoke that brings a rough wrinkle.'

Somehow, I just can't feature the sales pitch that goes: 'Smoke the new longer, king-size filter brand — it filters out everything, including beauty. It gives the cigarette smoker that new 'prune-like' look.'

With some women, this may do more to discourage smoking than the cancer scare. No woman relishes the idea of 'offering up burnt sacrifices in memory of departed youth.'

And there is one other somber but significant point. Habitual cigarette smokers may not live long enough to become as old as they look."

Seems to me that Brother Jim should have added one sentence to this provocative article, "What's good for the goose is good for the gander, too!"
