





TALL PAUL READING CLUB TO START

A children's reading club conducted by our Church Library will begin July 9 and will continue through Sunday, August 6.

Club requirements for Grades 1-3 will be eight books from the younger children's section in the Church Library.

Requirements for Grades 4-6 will be 5 non-fiction, 1 biography, and 3 fiction books from the older children's section.

All books must be checked out from the Church Library, and must be finished and cards turned in by Sunday, August 6.

Cards must be filled out and turned in for each book read.

Each reader will have an individual record card and as each book is read a brown spot is placed on Tall Paul on the individual record card. When the required number of books are read, a spot with reader's name on it will be placed on large Tall Paul.

Recognition will be given to each person who completes the required 8 books. Special recognition will be given the person who reads the most books from our church library during this period.

Elwin Garrett made the President's Honor Roll at Florida State last quarter, making 5 A's.




