# Pastor's Paragraphs

## "TEMPERATURE RISING"

The North Pole has long been famous as the home of Mr. and Mrs. S. Claus.

Perhaps you did not know that there is a real live Baptist Church in North Pole, Alaska. The church is making remarkable progress under the leadership of Pastor Bill Duncan.



Like most churches, First Baptist, North Pole, list in their weekly bulletin their attendance, additions, and offerings. Then they record one other most interesting fact — the temperature.

From their bulletin I note on January 13th, there were 318 people in Sunday School. The offering was \$719.00 and the temperature was -33 degrees. On January 20, there were 348 people in Sunday School, the offering was \$1472.00 and the temperature was a balmy -17 degrees!

Isn't it interesting that the offering more than doubled as the temperature went up. Coincidental? Perhaps.

Mark this down as a fact — when our hearts are warm, when we really care about the work of Jesus Christ, it's reflected in our giving. Giving little or nothing to the cause of Christ is a sure sign of spiritual sickness. The warm heart is a sign of spiritual health.

Regardless of what the temperature was outside, the Christians in Macedonia had warm — healthy — hearts. (See II Corinthians 8.)

To CARE is to GIVE. To LOVE is to GIVE SACRIFICIALLY.

You don't need a thermometer to check your spiritual temperature. Just look in the checkbook and you can see immediately whether your temperature is rising or falling.

### SEMINARY PROFESSOR TO LEAD BIBLE CONFERENCE



The study leader for adults and youth during our Bible Conference February 24-26 will be Dr. Harold S. Songer, Associate Professor of New Testament Interpretation, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. "Colossians: Christ Above All" will be the study.

Prior to joining the staff at Southern in 1962, Dr. Songer served as pastor of the West Side Baptist Church in Louisville; at the Cove Creek Baptist Church in Sherwood, North Carolina; and as assistant pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church in Elizabethtown, Tennessee. He also served as a teaching fellow at Southern while working on his graduate degree.

Dr. Songer is a graduate of Appalachian State Teachers University, Boone, N. C., and earned his B.D. and Th.D. degrees from Southern Seminary. He has also studied at Goethe Institute in Passau, Germany, and at Eberhard-Karls University in Tuebingen, Germany.

He has done extensive writing in the "Review and Expositor" and other religious journals and has just recently concluded the commentary on "James" for the Broadman Bible Commentary. He is the author of the textbook on Colossians being used in many Southern Baptist churches this year. Dr. Songer is married and has one child: Christopher Mark.

Dr. Songer will be preaching at the worship services on February 24, and will begin the study sessions at 6:00 p.m. Sessions will be held on Monday and Tuesday evenings at 7:00 P.M. There will be Bible study units for pre-schoolers and children.

### PUPPET TRAINING SEMINAR

On Monday, March 4, the New Californians Productions will present a one night Training Seminar in the use of Puppets. Training Seminar will feature "The Purple Puppet People", a professional group of puppeteers who will perform colorful puppet shows and demonstrations. They will teach the basic techniques of puppetry in the 3 1/2 hour seminar. Training will include: how to perform live shows and tape shows; using puppets as teachers; using puppets to teach music; how to manipulate hand puppets; using puppets in public schools; using puppets as an effective church ministry in Sunday School and Children's Church. The seminar is designed to train those who know nothing about puppetry, but want to learn. Also, the seminar will help polish those who have had some experience in puppetry. Registration fee for the Seminar is \$10.00 per person, but there is a special Church rate.
