"ON GROWING UP"

It's possible to grow OLDER without growing UP. The disciples could on occasion act very childish, even though they were grown men. However, there were times when they stood tall as mature people.



Consider this scene in the upper room. Jesus had just announced that He would be betrayed by one of the disciples. For a long moment, there was complete silence. You

could have heard a pin drop. Then someone broke the silence by asking the question, "Lord, is it I?" Then every man asked the same question, "Lord, is it I? . . . Is it I? . . . Is it I?"

Not a man pointed the finger of accusation at someone else.

"Lord, is it I?"

Not a man tried to escape his responsibility by blaming someone else.

"Lord, is it I?"

IT'S A SIGN OF REAL MATURITY WHEN WE LOOK INWARDLY — AT SELF — INSTEAD OF OUTWARDLY — AT OTHERS — WHEN PROBLEMS ARISE IN LIFE.

Meditate on the following questions. Ask yourself the question, "Lord, is it I?"

Am I so critical that I see only a person's faults and not his good points?

Am I so childish that people must handle me gently lest I be offended?

Am I mature enough to receive personal disappointments without feeling mistreated and making everyone else miserable?

Do I hurt other people while bragging, "I believe in saying what I think."?

Am I guilty of making sarcastic remarks about the success of others?

Am I big enough to admit when I'm wrong, or do I seek to excuse myself by blaming others.

Do I excuse my sins while self righteously condemning those of others?

When the good name of an outstanding person is undermined, do I silently rejoice, "That is what I thought all the time."?

When there are problems in the home, do I blame my husband or wife without considering my own shortcomings?

Sunday we'll observe together the Lord's Supper. What better time for self examination than when we gather about the table of the Lord.
