Pastor's Paragraphs

"THE MASTER AND THE MASTERS"

Perhaps the most sought after prize in golf is winning the Masters. This tournament is played each year in Augusta, Georgia. (I shared with you in a sermon recently my vain attempt to walk around the course — with or without shoes!)



This year's tournament was won by Mr. Gary Player of South Africa.

Few people expected him to win. Last year he had major surgery. There was some question as to whether he would ever play golf again. Prior to this, he had a recurring problem with his neck, which he broke as a 14 year old boy.

... But Gary Player won the tournament.

Gary Player has been a winner for years not only in golf, but in the game of life. He is a devout Christian. He thrilled our hearts when he spoke in our church some years ago.

Prior to playing the final round of the Masters, he wrote these words on his score card. "I can do all things through Christ, who strengtheneth me." (Philippians 4:13)

He read these words at least 18 times during the match. Every time he wrote down his opponent's score (the golfer does not keep his own score but that of his opponent), he was reminded of the fact — I CAN DO ALL THINGS THROUGH CHRIST.

This week the golfers are in Pensacola. Unfortunately, Mr. Player will not play in the Monsanto Open. It may well be that after his experience, several of them will write on their score cards, "I can do all things through Christ, who strengtheneth me."

I would be the last to say that everyone writing Philippians 4:13 down on a golf score card is going to win every time he plays, but . . . THE PERSON WHO LIVES BY THIS TEACHING IS SURE TO BE A WINNER IN A CONTEST THAT'S A LOT MORE IMPORTANT THAN ANY GOLF GAME — This contest is called LIFE.

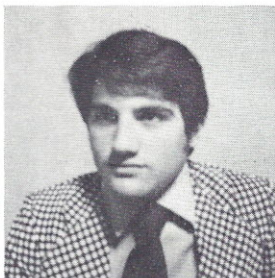

NOT EVEN FIVE CENTS FOR POSTAGE!

The postman stopped at my house and as usual I was glad to get mail. But on that particular day I could have wished he had passed me by. It turned out to be the most embarrassing news of my life.

I received a statement from the church where my family and I were members. We were fairly regular in attendance, and I was proud I had trained my children to be active in its program. I had voted heartily for home and foreign missions and was agreeable with any decision the church had to make.

I always read carefully the weekly bulletin that came by mail and on Sundays when I didn't attend church, I listened to the service on TV or radio. In sickness or sorrow, the pastor and other members of the church were there to help or comfort. We received the same benefits as any other member of the church. Yet, it never occurred to me that all these services required the support of all members — including myself.

The statement that came that day was the total sum of the amount I had contributed to the church for the past year. The total came to zero. On the Sundays we had attended, we had dropped a few coins and occasionally a few dollars in the collection plate. We always forgot to take our envelopes, but it didn't matter to us so long as the church received the money.

I had always figured that what I gave to the church was personal and it was no one's business but mine as to the amount. I am sure now that I was too ashamed for the little amount I gave to go on record.

I am determined that never again will I allow myself to be in a position to be embarrassed by withholding from God that which is rightfully his. All that I have belongs to him. And when I do stand before him in judgment, I too, want to see him smile and hear him say, "Thou has been faithful . . . enter thou into the joys of thy Lord."

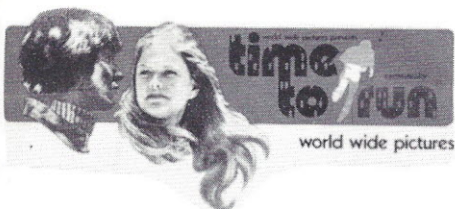
