Pastor's Paragraphs

"DEAD WEIGHT"

Sometime ago, a pastor wrote an article that caused me to stop and think. I would like to share it with you. He starts by asking a question:



"Are you a 'dead weight' to your church and the Kingdom of God?"

According to the Weymouth translation of 2 Corinthians 12:13, Paul is saying, "I myself have never hung as a dead weight . . ."

He has been slandered.

His enemies have accused him of being a burden to the churches, that he had profited unfairly from them. This he firmly denies by saying "I never hung like a dead weight on any church."

What a picturesque description of a large number of church members! Dead weights! Names "carried" on a church roll year after year with no response to show that they are living, vital parts of the body of Christ. Because they are dead they have to be carried, and a dead weight is hard to handle. It seems to weigh a ton. One strains every muscle in his body in his effort to lift a dead weight.

Yet this is the arduous task of most of our churches — trying to make headway with the Kingdom causes in this world, but staggering under people who are dead weights. Dr. Halford Luccock aptly describes such members in the following words: "Such people do not move the load; they ARE the load. They would be the first concern of a spiritual engineer who might be called in to study the causes of lost motion and energy in the church. Perfectly delightful people, most of them. They would scorn the suggestion that they could ever be classed as liabilities of the church. The simple trouble lies in their whole conception of the church as a sight-seeing bus rather than an engine pulling a load up a mountain. They insist on riding in a Pullman."

Paul said, "I never hung as a dead weight." And you ?
