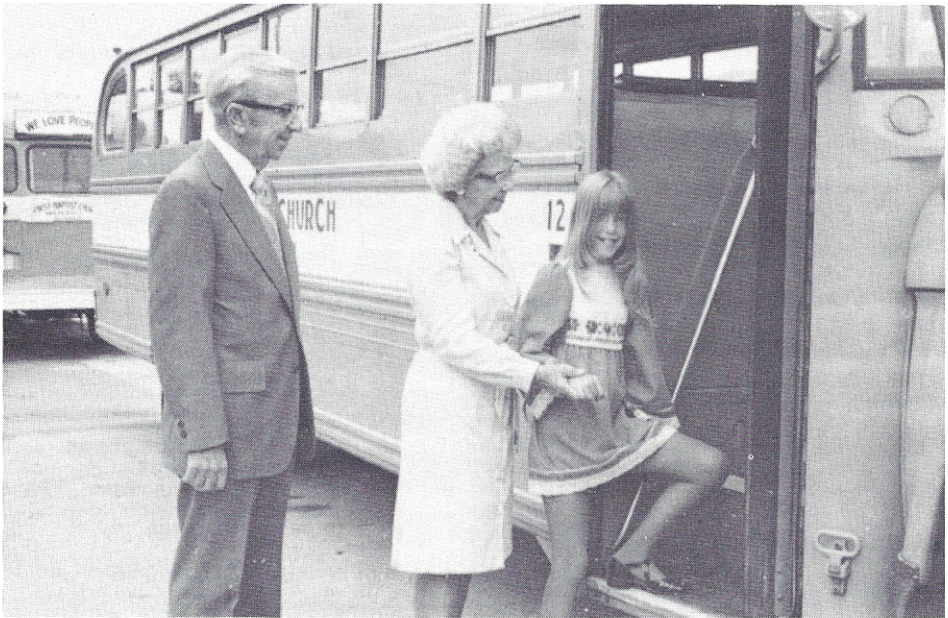

Pastor's Paragraphs

"ON WHAT'S EATING YOU"

It doesn't seem right. Who would have ever dreamed that Euell Gibbons would develop an ulcer. Mr. Gibbons stays close to nature, and is a great believer in the simple life. When he talks about a certain cereal that tastes like wild hickory nuts, he makes me want a bowl regardless of the hour of the day or night. Now we're told that Mr. Gibbons has developed an ulcer. I'll probably go back to my old cereal.



The number one cause of ulcers is not what you eat but what's eating you. Evidently, making all those T.V. commercials has caused Mr. Gibbons some problems that even wild hickory nuts won't cure.

If you are looking for the ulcer free life, consider this wonderful passage from the Word of God. LIBRARY NOTES

"TRACKS OF A FELLOW STRUGGLER"

By John Claypool

John Claypool is pastor of Broadway Baptist Church in Fort Worth, Texas. While serving as pastor of the Crescent Hill Baptist Church in Louisville, Kentucky, the Claypools learned that their eight year old daughter had acute leukemia. She lived only eighteen months and ten days after that first shocking news was given to her parents. What is it like to go through such a profound experience of grief? Does your Christian faith make any real difference? Out of the intensity of his personal struggle, John Claypool candidly shares his own deepest feelings in "Tracks of a Fellow Struggler." The book has four chapters. The first three were each written soon after crisis points had been passed — the shock of the first diagnosis, the first not unexpected but somehow unanticipated major relapse, the finality of death — and each reflects the overwhelming impact in unabated awareness. Chapter 4, written several years later, is a reflective overview. The book is subtitled "How To Handle Grief." The honesty of this preacher father will help anyone to be better equipped to handle grief.
