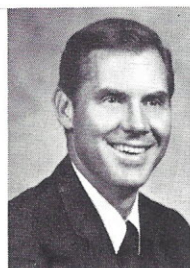
As a part of the service Sunday morning, we will have a Parade of Flags. Here Haylock is shown discussing the service with Sarah Andress, our WMU Director.



Pastor's Paragraphs

"COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS"

It's an old recipe. The language is archaic. It was written out for a bride 3 generations ago.



Probably the first 15 suggestions will not mean much to you, but number 16 is one that we should all think about, especially at this Thanksgiving season.

Consider an old washday recipe:

1. Bild a fire in the back yard to heat the kettle of rain water.
2. Pit on a pot of beans for your man.
3. Set tubs so smoke won't blow in eyes if wind is pert.
4. Shave one whole cake of lye soap in bilin water.
5. Sort things, make three piles, 1 pile white, 1 pile cullords and 1 pile work britches and rags.
6. Stur flour in cold water to smooth then thin down with bilin water.
7. Check beans, and salt. Add some sow belly.
8. Rub dirty spots on board, scrub hard, then bile, run cullord, but don't bile—just rench and starch.
9. Take white things out of kettle with broom stick handle then rench, blew and starch.
10. Spred tee towels on grass, hang rags on fence.
11. Check beans, wash turnip greens, pit them on to bile slowly with sow belly.
12. Pour rench water in flower beds.
13. Scrub front porch with hot soapy water.
14. Turn tubs upside down, so not to rust.
15. Stir greens and beans and make a pan of cornbread.
16. Go put on a cleen dress—smooth hair with side combs—brew a cup of tea, set and rest a spell in the rocker, then count your blessins.

Whether you spell it "blessins" or "blessings" we all need to stop and count them!
