THE STARS ARE READY FOR SUPER SATURDAY ARE YOU?

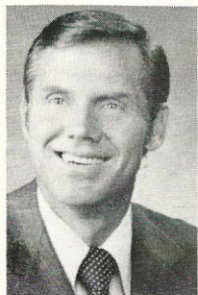

Pastor's Paragraphs

"AND HE MINISTERED UNTO ME"

Jesus Christ identifies with the needy. "For I was an hungered, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink:



I was a stranger, and ye took me in: Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me."

When the righteous answered and said that they had never seen Jesus in such need, He replied, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have

done it unto me."

In recent days nearly 5,000 needy people have arrived at our doors. These are the refugees from Vietnam now living at Eglin Air Force Base. They have many needs.

(See the article in reference to the need for clothing.)

The great need now is for sponsors. A sponsor is an individual who agrees to assist in the settlement of the refugee in his/her new American community. A sponsorship is primarily a moral obligation. However, it must be noted that the purpose of a sponsorship is to provide financial assistance to the refugees and prevent them from becoming a public charge.

I'm hopeful that our church can do something to meet this need. Perhaps you can help. Do you have a house that you could make available for a few months? More importantly, do you know where we might find work for a refugee? If you can be of assistance, please call the church office.

The good Lord willing, I'll look forward to seeing you in God's House Sunday.
