"IT WASN'T AS BAD"

Sometime ago I was visiting with a friend in the hospital. She had just recently had surgery. When I asked her how she felt, she smiled and said, "Not too good right

now, but you know
IT WASN'T AS BAD
AS I THOUGHT IT
WOULD BE."

Isn't this usually the case? Nine times out of ten it's not as bad as we think it will be, whatever "it" happens to be.

Most of us are prone to expect the worst. If there is sickness, we assume that it's going

to involve a lot of pain, and it will probably be terminal! If we're forced to discuss some unpleasant situation with someone, we assume that it will turn into a knock down, drag out fight. In most cases, it doesn't turn out like this at all.

Jesus Christ always anticipated the best. He was and is the world's greatest optimist. With the cross only a matter of hours away, Jesus said, John 16:33, "Be of good cheer; I have overcome the world."

Jesus constantly looked on the bright side of life, and He caused others to expect the best out of life too. The words "good cheer" were frequently on His lips. (See Matthew 9:2, Matthew 14:27, Mark 6:50)

The Apostle Paul caught the optimism of his Lord. Here was a man who was optimistic in the midst of trouble. (Acts 23:11, 27:22, 25,36)

Now just suppose it hadn't turned out the way it did. What if my friend in the hospital had said, "Not too good right now, and you know the operation was a lot worse than I expected."
