Tommy Ansley Licensed To Preach

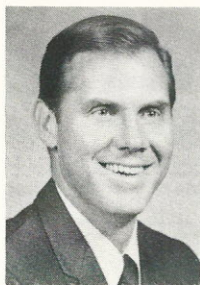

OPERATION T.A.N. RESULTS

Operation Tell-A-Neighbor has thus far uncovered 248 families in Pensacola who are prospects for Sunday School and church. There were 247 T.A.N. packets assigned to church members who volunteered to assist in the telephone survey and about 12,000 calls were made to area residents. The information on these prospects is in the outreach books in each adult Sunday School department. Each Sunday the department directors can provide names of prospects who need to be visited.
