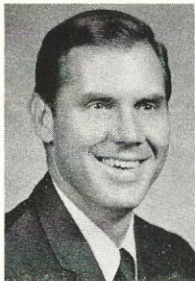
Kathy, Karen, and Jason Cofield are getting ready to join us for that fun week of Vacation Bible School, July 21-25. We hope you are planning to join us too.

Pastor's Paragraphs

"ON LIVING IN HURTSBORO"

There's a town in Alabama named HURTSBORO. I've never lived there, in fact I have never even been there.

On second thought, I've been to HURTSBORO. Many times. In fact, I've lived there. On numerous occasions.



No doubt, you too have lived in HURTSBORO. We all know what it is to live with hurt. That's for sure.

There are many reasons for our sojourn in HURTSBORO. Many times we find ourselves living in HURTSBORO because of the actions and attitudes of other people.

Years ago when I was just a little fellow, my childhood friend used to call me names. I would say to him, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but names will never hurt me." Even then, I knew that my words were untrue. You don't have to be an adult to live in HURTSBORO. Little folks, too, are forced to spend some time there.

The question is, "How do you get out of HURTSBORO?" The answers to this question are as numerous as the reasons for our being there in the first place.

Most folks will tell you the way out of HURTSBORO is the road called RETALIATION. If you're hurt, strike back. If someone sends you to HURTSBORO, make sure they too spend some time (preferably more than you have spent) in the same town.

Jesus Christ said the shortest (indeed the only) way out of HURTSBORO is the road called FOREGIVENESS. When people hurt us, we are to help them. If they pack us off to HURTSBORO, we are to pack them off to HAPPYVILLE.

This is what Jesus Christ said 2,000 years ago in the Sermon on the Mount. When we assist someone in moving to HAPPYVILLE, in a strange and wonderful way we find ourselves living in the same city. The good Lord willing I'll look forward to seeing you Sunday.

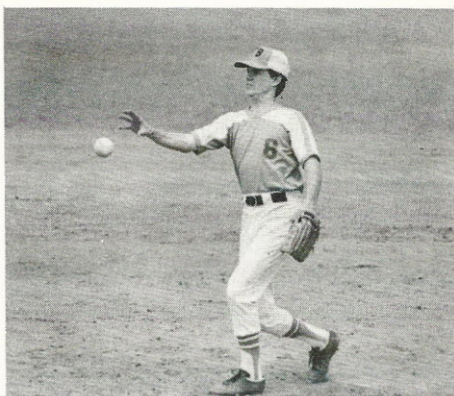
