A TIME TO SING



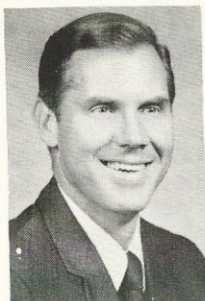
The 4th and 5th graders are getting a jump on the choir session. They have been involved this week in a choral workshop.

Pastor's Paragraphs

"CRY IN THE WILDERNESS"

The following was a guest editorial appearing in THE BAPTIST STANDARD July 23, 1975. It was written by George W. Hawkes, publisher of the ARLINGTON CITIZEN-JOURNAL of Arlington, Texas.



"One of today's noted philosophers and world statesman in the best sense of those terms is Charles Malik of Lebanon. The venerable Lebanese was formerly president of the United Nations General Assembly, his country's foreign minister and ambassador to the United States.

Today, Malik remains a good friend of the United States and his political views are still highly sought at home and abroad.

In a recent interview in Beirut with Lee Roderick of Scripps League Newspapers, however, Malik turned from politics to another subject he believes is more crucial—morals.

'There is a moral crash through the world,' Malik said, 'It expresses itself in 50, 60 different ways; and this is the greatest problem facing the United States, Western Europe and the world.

'Something must be done about it,' he said.

Malik, who is a prolific writer and lecturer, continued: 'When I read present-day literature and works on philosophy and theology and morals, I find myself before a complete breakdown of any sense of moral order or respect for standards of excellence or of certain ultimate values . . . I sometimes reach a conclusion that western civilization is in the throes of collapse, of self-destruction, of doubting its own fundamental values, of seeking things that are completely beneath what it has received from its deeper thinkers, writers, saints, politicians, statesmen and artists, for the last 2,000 years.

'This is very disturbing,' he added, 'and I find very few voices in high places which are speaking boldly, with conviction, without compromise on this matter.'

He suggested three approaches to stemming the moral decline: first, halt the decay of family life; second, spur the churches to rise to heights of leadership and challenge and conviction and suffering completely unprecedented in the history of the world; and third, change the character of the universities, reintroducing textbooks that teach solid, fundamental values.

'How to bring back God, Christ, values, truth, honesty, nobility . . . is to me probably the greatest single problem facing the world today,' he concluded.
