LEADING OUR DEACONS

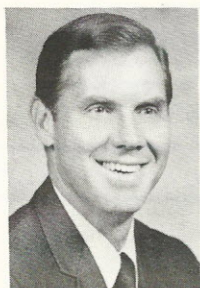

"THE CHRISTIAN AND CHURCH ATTENDANCE"

We can always look good if we make the right comparison. For instance — AS COMPARED WITH OTHER CHURCHES, the involvement of our membership in the



activities of the church is extremely good. The Sunday School has shown a consistent growth, and the attendance in the worship services both morning and night is excellent. We look good — real good — as compared with other churches. However, our involvement — AS COM-

PARED WITH THE TEACHINGS OF JESUS CHRIST—leaves much to be concerned about. So many of our members are not really involved in any phase of the church life.

How important is it for a Christian to be in church? Can't I be just as good a Christian and not go? The answers to these questions are — VERY and NO.

The problem of the inactive, indifferent Christian is not a new one. The author of Hebrews wrote, Hebrews 10:25, "Do not forsake the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching."

The born again Christian will be in God's House on His Day. To God's child, worship is NOT A DULL NECESSITY, but an EXCITING PRIVILEGE!

When we fail to worship the Lord, it may be an indication that we have never really made a commitment of our life to Him in the first place. I John 2:19, "They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us."

The Bible is plain. If I habitually, willfully stay away from church, IT IS SIN. In the case of many of us, our willful neglect touches the lives of lost young people in the home.

It may be that some of us need to fall on our knees right now and ask God to forgive us for our indifference and unconcern. When we come with sincere hearts asking to be forgiven, God is quick to answer our prayer. (See I John 1:8-10)
