The question that quite naturally pops into our minds when we read the sign is "HOW?"

All of us find the idea of being rich attractive. Jesus was aware of this fact and made frequent mention of treasure. However, Christ warned that we are to seek the true riches for riches can also be quite deceitful. (Matthew 13:22)



An abundance of possessions does not necessarily guarantee happiness. Mr. J. Paul Getty is one of the wealthiest men in the world. His dollars are measured not in millions but in billions—and yet by his own admissions, Mr. Getty is not a happy man.

Paul nearly wore out his pen writing about the true riches which are ours in Jesus Christ. (See Romans 9:23; Ephesians 1:18, 2:7, 3:8, 3:16; Philippians 4:19; Colossians 1:27)

When Jesus Christ is your Lord and Master, you are rich. It's not necessary for you to retire in order to begin enjoying the fruits of the Christian life.
