DEPARTMENT DIRECTORS LEAD THE WAY IN DECISION '76



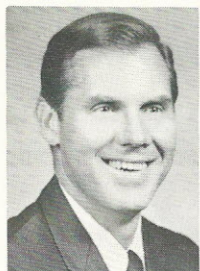

This was also a foretaste of the response of our people in pledging the '76 Budget.

Our Budget is 14% higher than the current year. This means that each of us will want to increase our pledge by at least 14%.

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Someone has said, "It is possible to give without love, but it is impossible to love without giving." This is a true fact of life. We can drop a coin in the hat of a



beggar on the street and do so without wanting to give of self and of money to help in his time of need. Likewise, it is possible for us to drop our offering envelope in the offering plate each Sunday and to do so without its being motivated by the spirit of love. By the same token, it is possible for us to possess

in our hearts a spirit of love without there being a willingness to give.

In the ministry of Christ we see this enacted in every experience of His life. He gave himself because He loved, yet it was because of his love that He was willing to give, "For God so loved — that He gave." God's love is best expressed by the gift that He gave. In these words from John 3:16 we immediately note that "love" precedes "give." In the matter of Christian stewardship we don't give in order that we might love, but it is because of our love that we are compelled to give. If we love and adore Christ, then we will of necessity give expression of this love in the act of giving. This giving is not limited to the matter of money. It includes time, talent and all that we possess. "Greater love hath no man than this that a man lay down (or give) his life for another." Our gift will be an expression of the degree of love that we possess for Christ.

I believe with all my heart that the membership of this church is going to exceed the goal of \$640,000.00 adopted by our church. I KNOW that if we really love the Lord, we will go far beyond it.

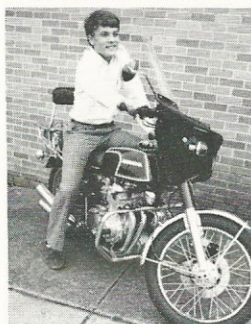
