

Read The Bible Through In 1975?



Pastor's Paragraphs

"THE SOUND OF SECURITY"

Some strange sounds can be heard coming from the maternity ward at St. Luke's Hospital in Racine, Wisconsin. Although some of the nurses have complained about it, the sound has a soothing effect on the newborn babies. The sound has helped them gain weight faster because they don't use up calories crying.



The sound is a soft whooshing sound similar to the sound of the Mother's pulse which the baby hears prior to birth. Hearing this sound has a calming effect on the newborn babies.

READ THE BIBLE THROUGH IN 1976

During the 1974-75 church year many of our members participated in reading the Bible through.

In 1976 the Home Life Magazine, Open Windows, Sunday School quarterlies will carry an outline of readings which will take you through the Bible in a year. This reading will consist of about 3 chapters a day. We will print the reading in the Builder each week. You may want to read a different version this time. Some have expressed a preference for reading straight through a book before going to another book. (The outline includes Old Testament and New Testament each day.) Here is a suggestion from Dr. Olin Binkley's book "How To Study The Bible":

"Read the Gospels in the following order: Mark, Matthew, Luke, John.

Read the books of the Old Testament in the order of the Hebrew Bible:

The Law: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy.

The Prophets: Joshua, Judges, 1 and 2 Samuel, 1 and 2 Kings, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi. The Writings: Psalms, Proverbs, Job, Ruth, The Song of Solomon, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, Esther, Daniel, Ezra-Nehemiah, 1 and 2 Chronicles.

Read the other books of the New Testament in the following order:

The Acts of the Apostles.

The Letters: Romans, 1 and 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 and 2 Thessalonians, 1 and 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, 1 and 2 Peter, 1, 2, and 3 John, Jude.

The Revelation of John.

We will give you an opportunity Sunday to commit yourself to this plan. Your commitment will encourage others.
