



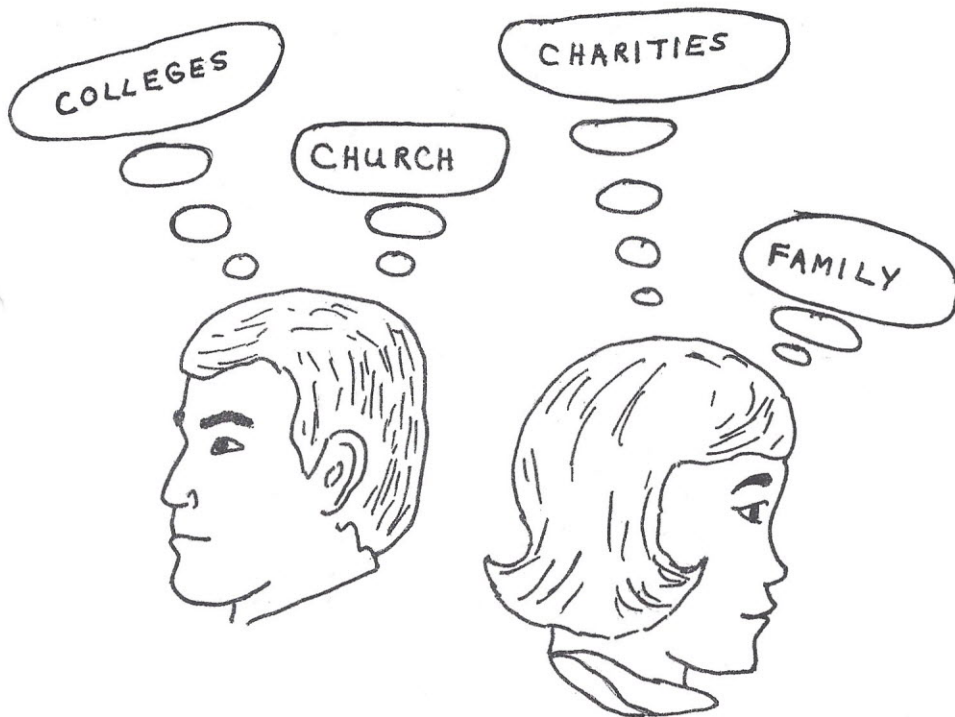

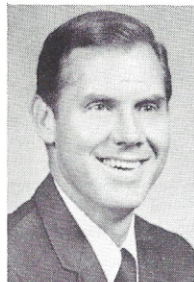

"OUR NATION'S GREATEST PROBLEM"

There are many problems facing our nation. What would you say is the number one problem facing America today?



Unemployment?
Inflation?
Recession?
Pollution?
Drugs?
Communism?

All of these are great problems, but the solution can be found for them if we can solve our nation's greatest problem which is APATHY. The "I don't care attitude" of many

Americans is the thing that is sapping the life from our nation.

A vivid illustration of this is the fact that more than 20,000 Escambia County voters will lose their right to vote unless they act now.

What do these 20,000 plus people have to do in order to obtain the right to vote? Pay a \$100 poll tax?

Write a thousand word theme on "Why I'm glad to be an American?"

Serve on a jury?

Enlist in one of the Armed Services for a year?

The answer to all of these is no. In order to retain the ballot, all these 20,381 people have to do is simply mail in a request for reinstatement. Every 2 years voters in Florida must re-register in order to vote. Last October 38,323 letters of renewal went out and thus far, 20,381 voters have not returned their request for reinstatement.

APATHY is the great foe facing America today.

The same problem plagues the church of our Lord Jesus Christ. APATHY is the great problem here too. Too many people with their names on the church roll couldn't care less. I venture to say that if we would send out a letter similar to the one used by the voter registration department, the results would be staggering.

Paul made a lot of people mad in the church at Corinth, but the question is valid not only then, but in our own day and age, "Despise ye the church of God?"

The person who habitually month after month stays away from church needs to give prayerful consideration to his relationship to Jesus Christ. The Bible says, I John 2:19, "They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us."

The person who loves Jesus Christ will love His church. In the Bible, the church is called the BRIDE of Christ. It is also
