

Pastor's Paragraphs

"WHERE THERE'S A WILL..."

In the past several months, a number of our members who wished to remain anonymous have given some big and magnanimous gifts to the cause of Christ.



Just recently one couple gave \$50,000 to establish a mission endowment fund. The interest from the fund will be given each year to the cause of world missions. In the years to come, many thousands of dollars will be

given through this fund to the world wide causes of Jesus Christ.

Others have given generous "over and above" gifts to a scholarship fund to help needy Seminary students. Still others have given sacrificially to the elevator and building fund.

The work of Jesus Christ is greatly blessed by these "over and above" love gifts. I stress "over and above" gifts because the total program of the church is dependent on our week by week faithfulness in bringing God's tithes and offerings into the storehouse.

Still, many of us need to do something "over and above" the giving of the tithe to the work of Christ.
