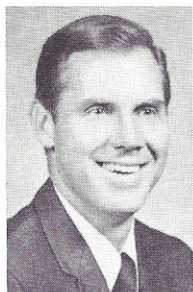

Pastor's Paragraphs

A JOURNEY OF LOVE

A Journey of Love — what a great description of the Christian life. It's a journey all right — there's nothing stagnant about it.



Most of the journey is an uphill climb. Jesus said it would be tough. In fact, he told his would-be followers time and time again to count the cost of discipleship. There's no such thing as a cheap salvation.

The person who dares to accept the challenge of Christ finds life exciting. Jesus meant it when He said, "I'm come that you might have life and have it more abundantly." Sad but true, many people are just alive when they could really LIVE IN JESUS!

It's a journey of LOVE. Love is the big word in the vocabulary of the Christian. Because of His love for us, we have been saved, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Because of our love for Him, we gladly serve Jesus Christ and put Him first in our lives. "For the love of Christ constraineth us . . . that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto Him which died for them, and rose again."

The good Lord continues to bless us in a marvelous way. In the past three weeks, there have been 15 professions of faith in Christ and numerous other additions to the church. We're saturated with bad news. I'd like to share with you some good news. CHRISTIANITY TODAY recently published the results of a poll among 22,000 "high achievers" conducted by "Who's Who among American High School Students" with the following results: those who believe religion plays a significant role in their lives, 86% as compared to 63% in 1972; those who identify with an organized faith, 80% as compared to 70% in 1972; 90% had never tried hard drugs; 73% never tried marijuana, only 27% supported its legalization; and "they are more puritanical on sexual issues and more old-fashioned in their attitudes toward marriage" than that same group surveyed in 1972. That's encouraging as we think of the future in America in 1976!

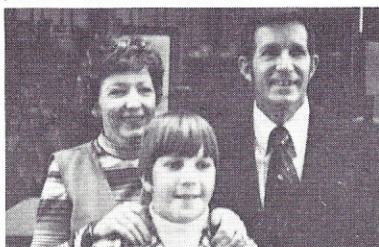
