Pastor's Paragraphs

REVITAL BEGINS MAY 28TH

When I ran across the word in a church bulletin, I thought the printer had made a mistake. Anyone should know the word is REVIVAL, NOT REVITAL!

As a matter of fact, the printer had not made a mistake. He printed exactly what he intended to print, "PRAY FOR OUR REVITAL".

Revival should be just that—REVITAL. The word revival means "to implant new life into". That's exactly what revival should do—implant new life in the church.

Our revitalizing revival begins May 28th. Between now and then we have a lot of work to do. The committees are already hard at work. Every member of this church family is asked to become directly involved.

Wallace Henley, who is pastor of the old Spanish Fort Baptist Church, will be our revival preacher. He formerly served on the staff of President Nixon. The revival services are scheduled for Friday, May 28th—Sunday, May 30th. CLEAR YOUR CALENDAR. Hopefully every member of the church will faithfully attend the revival services.

Most importantly, every member of the church should pray fervently for this revival. We haven't touched "the hem of the garment" as far as the power of prayer is concerned. Consider this one promise from the lips of Jesus. "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father. And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it."
