Hanberry plays the part of Daniel.

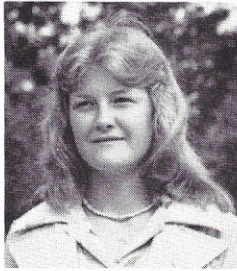




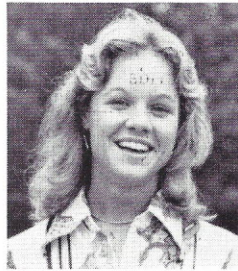
