



TO LEAD CHILDREN'S CHOIR CLINIC



Betty Shaw Woodward will be at First Baptist Church June 24th-26th to lead a Children's Choir Clinic for workers in our choir program and Sunday School.

The Clinic will open with a General Session Thursday evening and will have age-level conferences all day Friday and Saturday morning.

Mrs. Woodward earned the Bachelor of Music (With Honors) and Master of Arts degrees from the University of Kentucky. She has experience teaching public school music in Louisville, Kentucky and is currently an Assistant Professor of Music at Oklahoma Baptist University, where she has taught the past ten years.

Mrs. Woodward is Children's Choir Coordinator at First Baptist Church, Shawnee, Oklahoma, and directs the Young Musicians Choir. She has served as a festival director and workshop clinician in 17 states, she regularly serves on the faculty for Ridgecrest and Glorieta Music Week, and is a member of the writing team for *Young Musicians* and *Music Leader* magazines. Mrs. Woodward is also the author of *The Singing Book*.

In addition to staying active in her profession, Mrs. Woodward also has a family. She is the wife of James W. Woodward, who is Dean of the College of Fine Arts at Oklahoma Baptist University, and the mother of Julia (18) and David (16).


