## Declaration of Attendance in Pensacola, Florida

July 4, 1976

The Unanimous Declaration of The First Baptist Church:

We American Christians proclaim the United States of America to be the greatest among all the nations of the world. We believe our nation was established upon Christian precepts by men who had faith in Almighty God; that our nation has been signally blessed by God; and that the blessings of God upon us and our prosperity will not cease as long as America is faithful to God. We believe that the Lord's Church also exerted a profound influence upon our nation; and that its ministries have contributed to national strength.

We therefore solemnly declare our allegiance to Almighty God, His Church and our country; and furthermore we bear witness to this declaration of allegiance by mutually promising to be present for Bible Study and Worship on July 4, 1976 - America's 200<sup>th</sup> Birthday.


