CHURCH CALLS MINISTER OF ACTIVITIES AND YOUTH

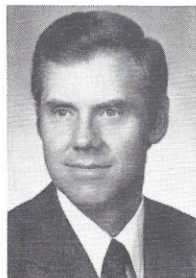

A few days ago Mr. Eugene Grubbs, who serves on the staff of our Foreign Mission Board, came to Pensacola to talk



to me about a proposed mission trip to Botswana, Africa. This small South African country will soon be celebrating their 10th anniversary as a nation. The government of Botswana requested our Foreign Mission Board to extend an invitation to a church in America to come to Africa and provide the music for

this important celebration.

In Acts 16, we are told about a Macedonian call that came to the Apostle Paul. Realizing the call was from the Lord, Paul immediately made plans to go into Macedonia. Even so, eleven (11) of our finest singers are now making feverish plans to head for Africa on September 20. Put these people on your prayer list and pray for them daily . . . Paul Royal, Bonnie Royal, Kaaren Miles, Elaine Kerley, Bob Belvin, Cecelia Belvin, Charlie Johnson, Tommy Poe, Kim Poe, Leon Starr, Scott Hetrick.

Botswana is not a large nation. The population is just 646,000. Included in this number are 24,000 Bushmen, one of the most primitive groups still found on earth.

Southern Baptists have been working in Botswana since 1968. We have thirteen (13) missionaries assigned here, including ten (10) career missionaries, two (2) missionary associates, and one (1) missionary journeyman. There are now three (3) small Baptist churches in the country with a total membership of under 100.

Famous names among missionaries who have served in Botswana include David Livingston and Robert Moffit who served here in the 1800's.

While in Africa, our Pensacola missionaries will have numerous opportunities to witness in song and words for Jesus Christ. Their ministry will literally touch the mainstream of the life of the nation. It is our responsibility to bathe this important mission in prayer.

After months of prayerfully seeking God's leadership, the church extended a call to Joe Palmer to become our Minister of Activities and Youth. Joe is presently serving the First Baptist Church of Gadsden, Alabama. He and his family should be in Pensacola by the middle of September. You're going to love the Palmers. The picture on the front page tells us a lot. What a happy family!

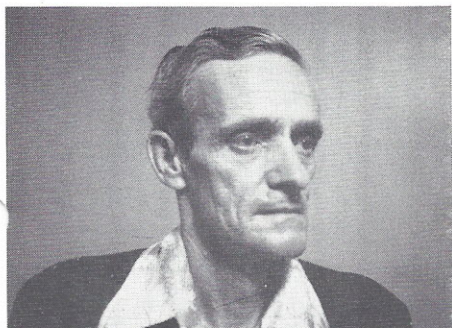
