Deputy Clerk: Raymond Taylor

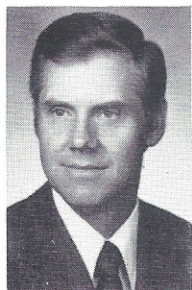


Shown left to right are Bill Lee, Ray Taylor, Max Dickson, and Charles Griffin.
