Notes From Kansas City

Florida was well represented on the Southern Baptist Convention Program. Harold G. Sanders, Tallahassee, was Chairman of the Program Committee. John H. Haldeman, Miami, presided on several occasions in his office of First Vice-President. He did a good job, too. Millard J. Berquist, Tampa, brought a forceful message on the beverage alcohol question. Earl B. Edington, St. Petersburg, read scripture and led in prayer at the opening session. Roy Angell, Miami, led in securing the first vote of approval (another is necessary next year to bring about Convention action) for a Southern Baptist Hospital in the Miami area. This approval was secured in the face of some very strong opposition. After all this was a Baptist meeting.

C. C. Warren, North Carolina, was re-elected as the Convention President.

Both the W. M. U. and the Convention voted approval of the transfer of the Carver School of Missions and Social Work to the Convention. This will be completed in the next year.

The Education Commission reported that Georgetown College and Oklahoma Baptist University are now added to the list of Southern Baptist Schools admitting Negroes. This makes a total of eleven Southern Baptist Schools now following this procedure.

Five Russian Baptists were present and reported something of the spiritual and evangelistic fervor of their Russian brethren. They indicated that every Russian Baptist is a "little Billy Graham." I got to shake hands with three of the five.

The three Nigerians whom I met at the Convention all know my sister, Emelle, who is stationed at Abeokuta.

My greatest "thrill" came as more than 10,000 people sang "The Lord's Prayer" at the close of the Youth Night program.
