THE SURVEY BULLETIN

The Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board, in its June meeting, appointed thirteen young people for overseas service, bringing the total number of active missionaries to 1,067.

More than ninety-three cents of every dollar received last year by the Foreign Mission Board went directly to mission fields—or \$10,017,383 out of \$10,736,271. Less than three cents of the dollar went for administrative expenses; slightly more than three cents, for promotion of the Board's work; and slightly more than half a penny of the Board's dollar went for general expenses.

Offenses related to alcoholic beverages caused 59 per cent of all arrests in the United States last year, the Methodist Board of Temperance reports. These arrests totaled 1,099,255 of the overall 1,861,764.

According to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Washington, D. C., philanthropic giving in 1954, latest year for which figures are available, reached an estimated record of \$5,401,000,000, of which churches and other religious agencies received \$2,850,000,000, or fifty-three cents of every dollar. In 1945, of \$3,299,000,000 contributed, only \$1,158,000,000, or a little more than a third, went to religious groups.

The American Baptist Convention, meeting in Seattle, Washington, has reported that Sunday school enrollment now exceeds the million mark for the first time in fourteen years. A unified budget of \$8,764,527 for 1957 has been adopted—


