

Home Again! When you receive this issue of the bulletin, vacation will be over for the pastor and his family. Time to go to work! Let's go!

My Preaching this fall and winter will be marked in part by our entrance into the new building. The last Sunday morning service in the old building will find us using the title, "Our Father's God". A series of three messages, "Symbols of Our Faith", will deal with scriptures involved in the symbols over the front doors of the new sanctuary. Another series of three messages, "Scriptures In Stone", will grow out of the passages inscribed over three of the other doors. Two groups of sermons will deal with the symbols portrayed in the stained glass windows. One will be called "A Story From Palestine" and the other, "Letting the Light Shine Through."

Your Help will be needed in the preparation of three messages that I plan to bring in September on "Favorite Texts In the Bible". I am asking that members of the congregation indicate their favorite texts at the services August 5. A blank will be provided on the Order of Service. You may be thinking about this between now and Sunday so that you will be prepared to indicate your favorite.

The Ten Commandments will be considered in a group of messages called "Anchors For The Storm." The series will answer the general question, "Will the Ten Commandments hold today?"

Individual Messages will probably be brought sometime during the fall and winter with such titles as "Military Morals", "The Extravagance of God", "When God Reads Statistics", "The Eyes of Jesus", "Born Rationalizers", and "The People Who Forgot".

You Will Understand that a minister's tentative planning of his preaching during his vacation is subject to change as the Holy Spirit leads. Certainly all of us would like to feel that the pastor is speaking under divine direction and not just as one man to others. One purpose of a minister's vacation is to give him an opportunity to "stand off" and look at himself, his people, what they have done or failed to do, and what they ought to be and do. Above all, it is a time for him to look again to Jesus for guidance as he prepares himself for preaching. The tentative plans that I have made are a result of looking to the Lord.


