PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING DEACONS

The Committee for the Nomination of Deacons requests that every member of the church suggest men who should be considered for nomination as deacons.

There is no set limit as to the number any one person can nominate. A candidate must have at least three (3) recommendations from the church to be placed on the ballot.

These suggestions must reach the Committee by Noon Sunday, September 9. They may be given to any member of the Committee, mailed to the Church Office in care of the Committee, or dropped in the offering plate.

Your Committee, selected for the purpose of recommending to the church the best qualified persons, wishes to submit the following Scripture passages for your guidance, and in turn requests that you offer the names of as many men as you believe to be qualified to serve as deacons:

SELECTION OF THE FIRST DEACONS:

"Now in these days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a murmuring of the Grecian Jews against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministration. And the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, It is not fit that we should forsake the word of God, and serve tables. Look ye out therefore, brethren, from among you seven men of good report, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. But we will continue steadfastly in prayer, and in the ministry of the word."—(Acts 6:1-4).

THE CHARACTER AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ALL DEACONS

"Deacons in like manner must be grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. And let these also first be proved; then let them serve as deacons, if they be blameless. Women in like manner must be grave, not slanderers, temperate, faithful in all things. Let deacons be husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. For they that have served well as deacons gain to themselves a good standing, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus."—(I Timothy 3:8-13).

We urge you to be much in prayer that we as a church may know God's will in this all-important task of making these nominations.

The first ballot will be on September 23 and twenty (20) men will be selected for the second ballot on September 30.
