
# Viewpoint

# Music Notes

Many people have expressed the opinion that our organ was "too loud." We want to point out several things which may help us to understand our organ and how best to use it.

1. It is not the same organ we had in the former sanctuary. It is enlarged by approximately 700 additional pipes, has a much larger blower, and considerably more room in the organ chambers. This makes it much larger in sound and also gives us a little more variety than heretofore.

2. It is a "basic" organ designed to serve a congregation of 2000 persons. It consists of "swell", "great", and "pedal" sections on two keyboards. It does not as yet include a "solo", "choir" and "echo" sections. These may be added later. This means that there is enough organ to meet the basic needs of congregational singing, and very little more, for the expressive and solo "stops" appear in the last named sections.

3. The only way for us to use our organ and realize its full value is for our congregation to sing "with the spirit and understanding" so that we "fill" the auditorium with joyous sound. It is a known fact that when you sing you need more organ in order to hear it. It is the desire of your Minister and your Music Director that our people should enjoy themselves when they sing. The way to happiness through music is to participate. If you sing, the organ will be just about "right"! Try it!

"MESSIAH" rehearsals are progressing nicely. The CHURCH CHOIR will remember the schedule for next week. Monday night we sing for the Training Union Mass Meeting, "M" Night. Tuesday night at 7:00 a special practice in the Auditorium and the regular rehearsal on Thursday night at 7:00. Let us be faithful as we prepare ourselves for telling the greatest story in song ever told.
