Malachi quoted God as saying, "Will a man rob God? Yet ye rob me" (3:8). The prophet was not talking about the men who broke into our church. He was talking about God's people. He added, "But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings." I wonder how many robbers Malachi would say that we have had at church lately?

Budget—Our 1957 pledges now amount to \$160,210.99. Our goal: \$176,363.00.

The Picture—At the 11:00 a.m. service last Sunday, Mr. S. L. Davis, Chairman of our Building Plans Committee made it clear to the congregation that at least \$25,000 is needed for the Building Fund at once to enable us to care for present obligations in our construction program.

Mrs. Jess Miller has agreed to serve as supply organist for the present. We are grateful for her ministry in this field.

The Messiah is to be presented twice in our sanctuary. Sunday morning our choir will bring excerpts at 11:00 a.m. On Monday night, at 8:00 o'clock, the Pensacola Oratorio Society is to present the complete work by Handel. These should be great worship experiences.

The County Commissioners have been asked by the Pensacola Ministerial Association to prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages from midnight Saturday night until 7:00 a.m. Monday morning. Some of us who prefer that there be no legal sale of alcoholic beverages at any time think that the ban on Sunday sales would be a desirable step in the right direction. Let your Commissioners know how you feel.

Revival Services are being planned for February 17-24. Your pastor will preach. In 1958 we are to have Dr. Earl Guinn of Louisiana. In 1959, Dr. J. Winston Pearce of Baltimore, Maryland is coming.

Music Notes

Some interesting facts concerning the "MESSIAH" by George F. Handel. It was written over two hundred years ago in only 24 days. There are 53 different selections including instrumental pieces, recitatives, arias, and choruses. It is divided into three parts: the first concerned with the prophecy and birth of Christ; the second concerned with His crucifixion and burial; the third with the resurrection and salvation. Rarely is it performed in its entirety—the full performance requiring approximately three and one-half hours. It should be sung with an orchestra and an average size chorus. Its popularity is universal because the average church choir is capable of performing it as well as large massed choirs. It was not intended to be sung by a large choir but by a group with limited musical resources. Through the years it has been an inspiration to countless thousands and its presentation has become traditional in many towns. It is our hope that our people will find it entertaining as well as proving to be a rich blessing spiritually.

Your CHURCH CHOIR will perform a portion of this great sacred choral masterpiece for the Morning Worship Service this Sunday. Invite your friends.

"M" Night Monday night proved a high point for your Minister of Music. The people SANG and it sounded wonderful. We can make the singing of hymns a wondrous experience, but remember ONLY YOU CAN DO IT! Christmas is a time for rejoicing and happiness and there is no better way to express it than through singing. Fifteen hundred people SINGING is wonderful. Three hundred singing and twelve hundred listening makes for mournful music. Let's be a singing church!
