

## LIBRARY NOTES

Dr. Wayne Dehoney, who was president of the Southern Baptist Convention 1964-1966, has written a book entitled "African Diary". He gives a very graphic picture of our missionary work in Africa, our missionaries and the countries he visited. Of Lagos, the cap'tol of Nigeria, he writes: "And pagan practices still prevail even in a modern city like Lagos," Cecil Roberson remarked as we came to the bridge over the Otun River and saw the net-laden dug-outs of the fishing fleet. In the Yoruba pantheon, Olokun is the god of the sea. Once a year there is a fishing festival in Olokun's honor. Fishermen decorate their canoes with palm branches and colored paper. Crowds, drunk on palm wine, sing and dance in the streets. Sacrifices — a turkey, a pigeon, a piece of white cloth, ko'a nuts, yams — are offered to Olokun that he might bless the fishermen with a good catch. Even many Christians and Muslims participate in this festival. Pagan? Certainly. But what about Mardi Gras in New Orleans or the priestly blessing of the Florida sponge fleet at Tarpon Springs, I thought!"
