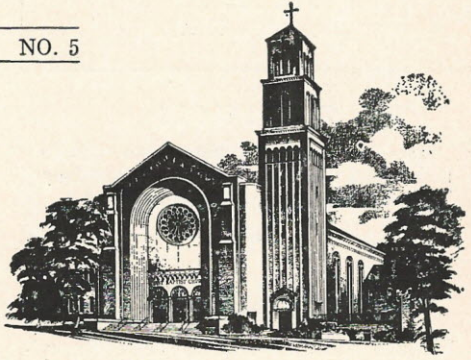

ALL PEKING CHURCHES CLOSED

Reports that all Christian churches in the Communist China capital of Peking have been closed were confirmed by persons arriving here from the Chinese mainland.

(There are reportedly 200,000 Christian among China's population of 700 million.)

Churches were closed in August by Red Guard followers of Communist chairman Mao Tse-tung at the start of the current cultural revolution.

Churches in the capital city are covered with red-painted extracts of Chairman Mao's writings.

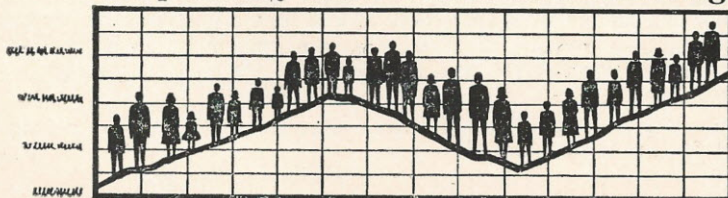
A banner proclaiming "Long Live Mao" is flying from the spire of a former Catholic cathedral in Peking.

Red Guards are reported using former Christian churches in Shanghai as assembly halls. Edifices in Shanghai are being stripped of their religious relics and decorations, and spires and belfries are torn down.

Observers here said that never before in this century had Christians in a Chinese city been barred from public worship on Christmas Day. They noted that, although the Communist regime's constitution guarantees freedom of religion, practicing Chinese Christians still living in Peking have been forced to go underground to worship.

Three percent because of the ministers of the church.

Twenty-two percent because there were people in the church whom they respected.

Thirty-four percent because neighbors or friends invited them to that church.
