

THE LORD'S SUPPER

"There are two great ordinances set in Baptist church, and only two—Baptism and the Lord's Supper. They do not come from men. They are divine appointments. Since the deep gracious meanings of Christianity are symbolized by these ordinances, their observance is fraught with far-reaching moment to both the church and the world.

"Jesus does not say, 'This do in remembrance of certain loved ones,' or to show fellowship with them, but 'This do in remembrance of Me.' It is the only thing He ever asked his people to do whereby they might remember Him. Shall we deny Him this simple request? It is not a question of Christian fellowship. There are other times and places for the tender and beautiful manifestation of Christian fellowship, but this is not the time nor the place to be thinking of that. 'This do in remembrance of Me'".
