(NOTE: In case of heavy rain, we will have the picnic and Prayer Service in the Church Dining Room.)

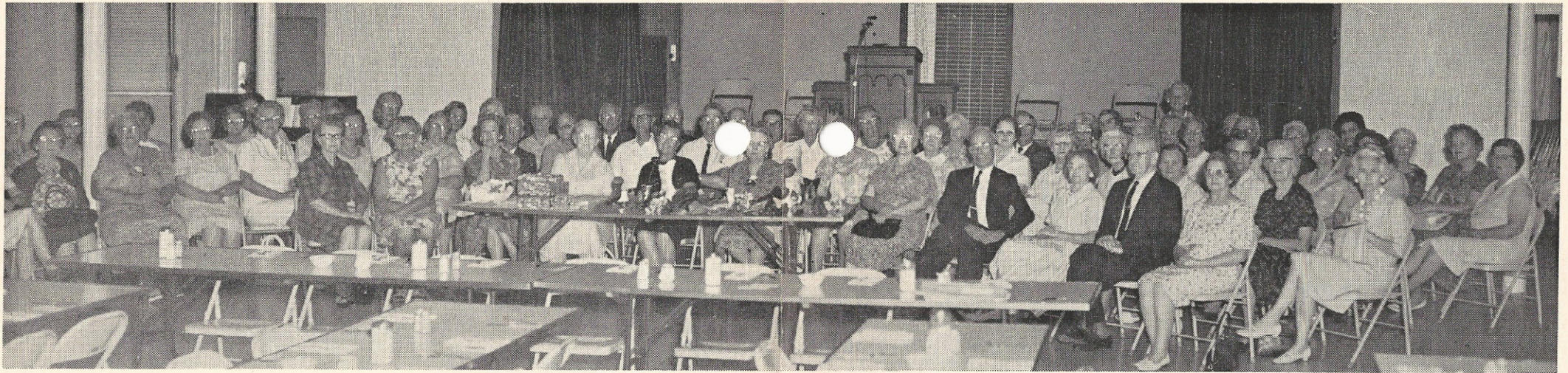
