Pastor's Paragraphs

AND NOW A WORD FROM OUR COACH

It happens quite frequently. Scarcely a week passes without someone asking me, "What shall I call you?". In most cases the questioner will then throw out a number of suggestions. "Shall I call you Reverend, or Doctor, or Pastor, or just plain Mister?"

Now I would have to say that of all these words, Reverend leaves me the coldest. Call me anything, but don't call me Reverend. Doctor also has to be eliminated since I am not even a registered

nurse. This leaves Mister, Preacher, and Pastor. Of these three, my preference is Pastor. But I am not sure that this is the best word to describe my position.

How about COACH Ple.tz. Sometime ago I said in a sermon that the leader of the congregation should be looked upon as a playing coach. Dr. Elton Trueblood in his book entitled **The Incendiary Fellowship**, made this same suggestion. "Some are now coming to believe that the least inadequate or distorting term for a spiritual leader in a congregation is 'coach.' This word has overtones which modern man comprehends very well, indeed.

The glory of the coach is that of being the discoverer, the developer, and the trainer of the powers of other men. But this is exactly what we mean when we use the Biblical terminology about the equipping ministry. A Christian society is made up of men and women whose powers in the ministry are largely unused because they are unsuspected. The Christian coach will be one who is more concerned, therefore, in developing others than in enhancing his own prestige. Ideally, he will not do anything himself, if another can be enabled to grow by being encouraged to do it."

This may come as a surprise to some but as your coach I am not going to give you any new plays, but I do hope we will learn the old ones and put them into practice. Remember, wherever you are the game is on. The season lasts for a lifetime. I am going to do my best to please our Owner. How about you?

I hope you will congregate (Excuse me, huddle) with us at the church Sunday.
