Church To Vote On Building



Pastor's Paragraphs

WHAT I OWE MY NEW PASTOR

As of yet, the date of his arrival is known only to God, but one day soon your new pastor will arrive in Pensacola. (He doesn't



know it yet, but he is a very LUCKY fellow. The good Lord has surely taken a special "liking" to the man he sends to pastor this wonderful church.)

There are several things that you can do that will help your new pastor when he arrives.

BE PATIENT. Be patient with your new

pastor. It takes a lot of time to get settled when you move to a new church field. Do not expect him to be like your OLD pastor. (Did I hear someone say "Thank the Lord for that!") Refrain from saying, "But Dr. Pleitz, etc." Don't expect him to call you by name for a while. He is trying to learn 3,000 new names. When you meet him, repeat your name over and over again.

BE PRAYERFUL. Pray for your new pastor. The responsibilities facing any pastor are great. The responsibilities facing your new pastor are HUMONGOUS. It's a frightening thing to be charged by Almighty God with the welfare of a great church. Your pastor will be involved in a lot of community activities too. He needs your prayers. Paul said in I Thessalonians 5:25, "Brethren, pray for us." He repeated it in II Thessalonians 3:1, "Brethren, pray for us." The writer of Hebrews said in Hebrews 13:18, "Brethren, pray for us." I'm sure your new pastor would say, "Please, please pray for me."

BE PRESENT. If you have prayed for your pastor, it's really not necessary for me to even mention this next thing. For if you've prayed for him, you will be present. It sounds like such a little thing, but it isn't. You owe it to your pastor to be present in the worship services to hear what God has revealed to him through prayer and Bible study. God's pastor doesn't stand behind the pulpit to make a little talk from Sunday to Sunday. He stands behind the sacred pulpit to share with you the truths that God has revealed to him. The person who habitually misses the worship services is missing a great blessing. He is saying by his absence, "What you have to say is of no concern to me." Quite frequently, folk will use the children as an excuse to leave after Sunday School. Deep down inside, we know the problem is not with the little folk, but with our indifference.






