

SUNDAY IN OUR PULPIT



Dr. Landrum Leavell, President, New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary will be the preacher at First Baptist Church Sunday.

In 1975 Dr. Leavell resigned the pastorate of the First Baptist Church, Wichita Falls, Texas to accept the responsibilities, duties and privileges as President of the New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. He is the son of Mrs. Leonard Leavell and the late Dr. Leonard Leavell, who was a Baptist minister until his death in 1952.

Born in Ripley, Tennessee, Dr. Leavell is a graduate of Newnan High School, Newnan, Georgia and received his ThD degree from New Orleans Seminary in 1954, with a major in Greek New Testament.

Dr. Leavell has served on all major committees of our convention, serving as 1st Vice-President of SBC in 1967-68. Before his pastorate in Texas he pastored four churches in Mississippi, the last being the First Baptist Church of Gulfport.

He is married to the former Jo Ann Paris of New Orleans. Dr. and Mrs. Leavell are the parents of four children.

Every member of First Baptist Church is urged to be present Sunday to welcome Dr. Leavell and support him with your prayers and presence as he preaches.

I HAVE A QUESTION

Q. Exactly how much money are we trying to raise in this campaign?
 A. We are not asking for cash offerings during this campaign, only pledges. Our goal is \$750,000 plus in pledges to be paid over a three-year period.

Q. When do the pledges start?
 A. We begin paying on our pledges December 1, 1977.

Q. What is the weekly goal?
 A. To reach the \$750,000 goal in three years, we must give \$5,000 weekly.

Q. Will I be asked for a pledge publicly?
 A. No. Neither will your individual pledge be announced.

Q. How do we make our gifts toward the building?
 A. Our special building fund offering envelopes will be mailed out for use prior to December 1, 1977.

Q. Do you think God will help me meet a pledge which right now seems beyond my means?
 A. Just as surely as He helps us in any other area of life. A large pledge often means large faith. A small pledge often, but not always, means little faith.

Q. Where will pledges be made?
 A. Most pledges will be made in the homes. Canvassers will telephone in advance to find when they may call at a time convenient with your family. Our canvassers are busy people, and we would not want them to call when you were not home. The telephone appointment saves the canvasser's time as well as your own.

Q. What will the canvassers say when they visit my home?
 A. It is easier to indicate what they will not say. They will not say anything embarrassing or of a high-pressure nature. They will answer any questions. They will have with them a card for each member of the family who is a church or a Sunday School member.

Q. When will I sign my card?
 A. While the canvassers are there so they can return it the same evening to the Canvas Director. Canvassers must account for every card, and they cannot leave cards in the homes.

Q. Can we make a family pledge?
 A. Yes, but we are urging it be divided among the family members.

Q. Can I give toward my pledge once a year or every three months?
 A. Yes, although most of us find it easier to keep up week by week.

Q. Can I change my pledge later on?
 A. Yes, because the future for all of us is uncertain. Some of us will be blessed so that we can increase our pledge. Unfortunate circumstances beyond our control may force some of us to lower or cancel our pledge entirely.

Q. Will canvassers call on Sunday School pupils who are not church members?
 A. Yes, to give them an opportunity to pledge if they wish. Church members are asked to pledge; Sunday School pupils are invited to pledge.

Q. Will my pledge constitute a permanent investment?
 A. Yes. Take the example of George W. Carroll, a wealthy Texas philanthropist. He gave large sums to Baptist causes. After he had lost considerable wealth in depression years, he was viewing a building he helped construct. Someone said, "Aren't you sorry now you gave all that money away?" He answered, "No, because all I kept for myself is lost, and only that which I gave away has been preserved." And so it may be in our lives. When the gaudy, tinselled things of life are gone, that which we have invested in Christ's cause will continue to flourish and bear fruit.
