Our preacher for next Sunday is to be Dr. Glendon McCullough. Dr. McCullough is a native of Griffin, Georgia. He is a graduate of Baylor University, and attended Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He has served as a pastor, as the Dean of Men at Baylor University, as Royal Ambassador Secretary for the Georgia Baptist Convention, as Associate Pastor of Druid Hills Baptist Church, Atlanta, Georgia, as Secretary of the Department of Missionary Personnel, Home Mission Board, and since November of 1971, as the Executive Director of the Brotherhood Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention.
