OUR PREACHER FOR SUNDAY



Our preacher for Sunday is to be Dr. William G. Tanner, Executive Director-Treasurer of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board.

Dr. Tanner is a native of Tulsa, Oklahoma; he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree at Baylor University, Waco, Texas; Master's and Doctor of Education degrees from the University of Houston and Bachelor of Divinity and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Texas. In 1975, Baylor University awarded him a Doctor of Laws degree and in 1976, he was named recipient of Southwestern Seminary's Distinguished Alumni Award.

He has served as pastor of churches in Wheelock, Houston and Cliburne, Texas and Gulfport, Mississippi.

He has held numerous positions in religious and secular educational groups and in professional civic, fraternal and service organizations. He has written articles for many denominational publications and has been speaker for student conferences, commencements, numerous State Conventions and Convention wide Conferences at Glorietta and Ridgecrest. During 1977, he traveled extensively visiting Home Mission Work, including a tour of Alaska. He has accepted preaching missions for the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board, being sent to the Far East and to South America.

He was elected Executive Director-Treasurer of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board in July of 1976 and assumed that position on July 1, 1977.

He will be preaching at the service Sunday morning at 11:00 and again Sunday evening at 7:15.
