


OUR PREACHER FOR SUNDAY



We are happy to announce that our preacher for Sunday will be Dr. J. Leo Green, distinguished Professor of Hebrew and Old Testament Interpretation, Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, Wake Forest, North Carolina.

Dr. Green is a native of New Albany, Mississippi. He is a graduate of Mississippi College, Clinton, Mississippi. He was named a full professor at Southern Seminary immediately upon receiving the PhD Degree in 1939. He taught there until 1948 when he became pastor of the First Baptist Church in Pensacola, Florida. From here he went to the pastorate of the First Baptist Church, Gainesville, Florida. He was a member of the original Board of Trustees when Southeastern Seminary was created by the Southern Baptist Convention in 1950. After the new Seminary's trustees had elected the school's first president, Dr. Green was named to the faculty. He is the only remaining member of the original faculty.

He is a frequent teacher of Bible Conferences; he is the author of the commentary on Jeremiah and the Broadman Bible Commentary. He will retire at the end of the current academic year at Southeastern.

We're delighted that he will be with us on Sunday and you'll want to hear him twice Sunday.



EX-MOONIE TO SPEAK



Chris Elkins, an ex-Moonie, will speak Wednesday night, May 3rd, in prayer meeting at 6:30 p.m. He grew up as a member of a Southern Baptist church in New Mexico. While a student of the University of Arizona, he recruited followers of Rev. Moon and became a member of the One World Crusade of Rev. Moon's organization.

Chris was a member of the Unification Church for 2½ years. He sang with the New Hope International Singers choral group and helped manage the movement Ginseng Teahouse in Washington, D.C. Before long he became a Special Project Assistant to Neil Salonen, President of the Unification Church in America. He was Managing Editor of the RIZING TIDE paper of the Freedom Leadership Foundation. He also worked as a Special Liaison on Capitol Hill for the Freedom Leadership Foundation.

He came out of the Unification Church on his own in January of 1976. He has appeared on two national TV shows, ABC's CLOSEUP and NBC's WEEKEND COVERAGE of the Unification Church. He has also spoken to churches and local campus groups and has appeared on radio talk shows dealing with the Unification Church.


