

FORMER PASTOR PREACHES SUNDAY



Dr. Elwin L. Skiles, Chancellor, Hardin-Simmons University, Abilene, Texas, will be our preacher for Sunday's services. Dr. Skiles was pastor of this church 1949-1953. For the benefit of those who do not know, he is a native Texan, has Bachelor and Master's degrees from Baylor University, has the Master of Theology and PhD degrees from Southern Seminary in Louisville.

He served as a Navy Chaplain during World War II. He was pastor of the First Baptist Church in Georgetown, Kentucky prior to coming to Pensacola and from here went to the pastorate of the First Baptist Church in Abilene, Texas. He was chosen as the President of Hardin-Simmons University in 1966 and continued as President until 1977 when he became Chancellor.

Mrs. Skiles will be with him this weekend as they are on their way to the Southern Baptist Convention in Atlanta.


