Dr. Weaver is a native of Oxford, Alabama, a graduate of Samford University and of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. He has an honorary doctorate from Samford University.

Dr. Weaver served as a chaplain in the United States Navy, as Director of Religious Activities at Samford, as Director of the Department of Baptist Student Work in Alabama, as Pastor of the First Baptist Church, Sylacauga before becoming the founding president of Mobile College on April 1, 1961. This school is an agency of the Alabama Baptist Convention.

He has been and continues to be active in civic work in Mobile and is a member of the First Baptist Church of that city.

CHILDREN'S MUSIC ACTIVITIES


During the month of August we want to focus your attention on the music ministry of First Baptist Church. Music is a vital part in the life of any church and encompasses all age groups. One such group is the children.
