Rev. Bill Mumby, Associate Pastor of the Purley Baptist Church in England, will preach for us on next Sunday evening.

Rev. Mumby has been a minister since 1963. He received 4 years in theological college training in Yorkshire.

As Associate Pastor of the Purley Baptist Church, he pastors one of their missions (called "Fellowship") of 56 members. The fellowship is called "The Old Lodge Lane Baptist Church," and is located about 12 miles from the Tower of London.

He and his family are in this country on a "pulpit exchange" with the pastor of the First Baptist Church in Flomaton, Alabama. We are delighted that the Flomaton Church is sharing him with us on this Sunday.
